Leases

- Cannot affect whether chattel or fixture
- Can affect ownership
- Can assist in clarifying intentions
- Additions and improvements
- Position where there is no lease (or a licence)





The Four Questions

What is the legal category of the item?

 Is it landlord's or tenant's i.e. who has the primary liability?

 Does the insurance policy cover the party's interest on the basis of primary liability alone?

Is the position modified by the terms of any lease?
